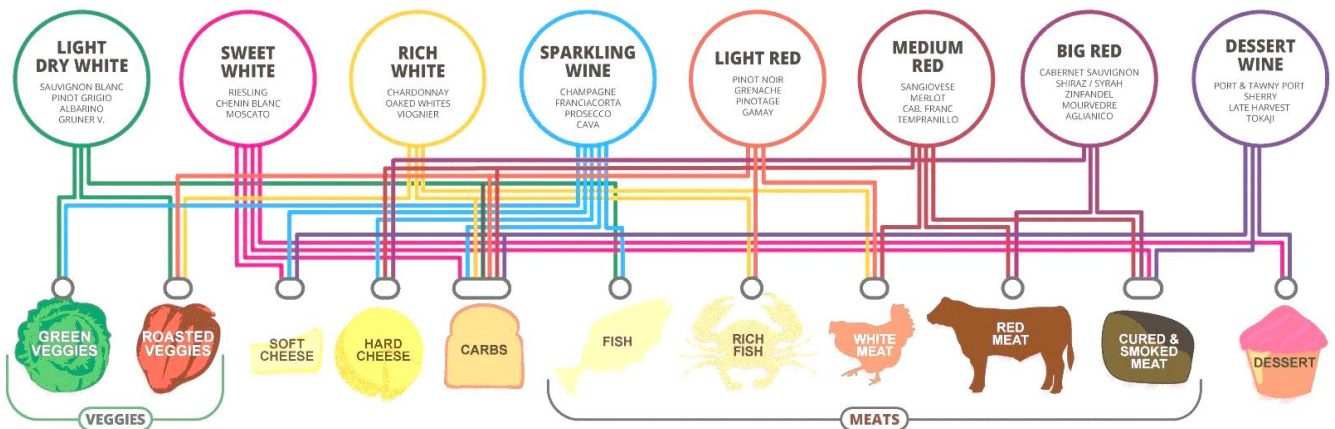


Kia Ora!

WINE REGIONS OF NEW ZEALAND

The wine regions in New Zealand are spread throughout the country, from Central Otago in the south to Northland in the north. Despite being a relatively small country, the geography is dictated by its volcanic and glacial history, and this provides a huge variety of soil types and landscapes which contribute to New Zealand's varied wine industry. As well as the change in latitude producing varying climatic conditions from North to South, the landscape also produces microclimates on top of this. We see a climatic variation from East to West with the prevailing weather patterns typically coming from the West. With no land mass to break these up until South America, the West Coast sees wild and treacherous conditions, a stark contrast to the relatively calm and tranquil weather typically seen on the East Coast. Wine producers therefore have a myriad of options when deciding what to grow and where to grow.

There are over 2000 vineyards in New Zealand, just 0.5% of the world's total plantings. Despite this, quality has won over quantity. Since the 1980's, when New Zealand Sauvignon Blanc broke onto the international stage, the reputation of all New Zealand wine has only grown and spread across the world.

Throughout this wine list, we will introduce each wine region and discuss what makes them so unique. These will serve as comparisons to our 'Old World' examples of the same grape varieties.



CENTRAL OTAGO AND THE WAITAKI - WINE PRODUCTION

Central Otago is one of the youngest wine regions in New Zealand with commercial vineyards only being planted in the 1980s. Despite this, it has earned international acclaim for its Pinot Noir in particular. With a latitude matching that of Burgundy, it is perhaps no surprise that Pinot Noir and Chardonnay flourish. Not bound to the strict winemaking laws in France though, the region has also been able to show its strength in other varietals. Chardonnay, Pinot Gris and Riesling are made to a very high standard.

Due to the cool climate in the most southerly wine making region in the country, the wines are delicate and elegant. Because of this, wines from the region tend to have a lighter winemaking influence, particularly with regard to oak use. If used, it is primarily old oak used, so as not to overpower the delicate fruit flavours. White wines show bright green and citrus fruit flavours setting them apart from the rest, and the red wines show subtle, complex flavour profiles, with delicate red fruit at the forefront.

Several winemaking sub-regions make up Central Otago, as detailed in the map below. Gibbston is the coolest, sitting at a slightly higher altitude to the Cromwell Basin. It therefore tends to produce lighter wine with more herbaceous flavours coupled with red fruit. Bendigo is the furthest north and warmest sub-region. It is also the driest due to its location furthest east from the Pisa Range which produces a rain shadow from the very heavy rainfall on the West Coast. As such, it produces darker fruit flavours and can handle slightly more oak influence. Bannockburn is a slight anomaly. Despite being the furthest south it actually has a very high average temperature. This is due to the amphitheatre of mountains surrounding it, which create a heat trap. It also faces directly north increasing the hours of sunlight it sees each day. It produces some of the highest regarded wine from the region. With climate warming having an ever-increasing impact, some producers are starting to experiment with the thicker-skinned Syrah. This practice is very much in its infancy but it could be Central Otago's future.

Despite sitting further north, the Waitaki Valley is New Zealand's coolest and also smallest wine growing region, with temperatures cooled by regular winds whipping through the valley from the east coast. Plantings are limited, totalling just 60ha, and take a lot of work to do well.

Varietal Production

Despite the fame, only 5% of New Zealand's vines are planted in Central Otago. Of this:

- Pinot Noir – 81%
- Chardonnay – 4%
- Pinot Gris – 8%
- Riesling – 3%
- Sauvignon Blanc – 2%
- Other – 2%

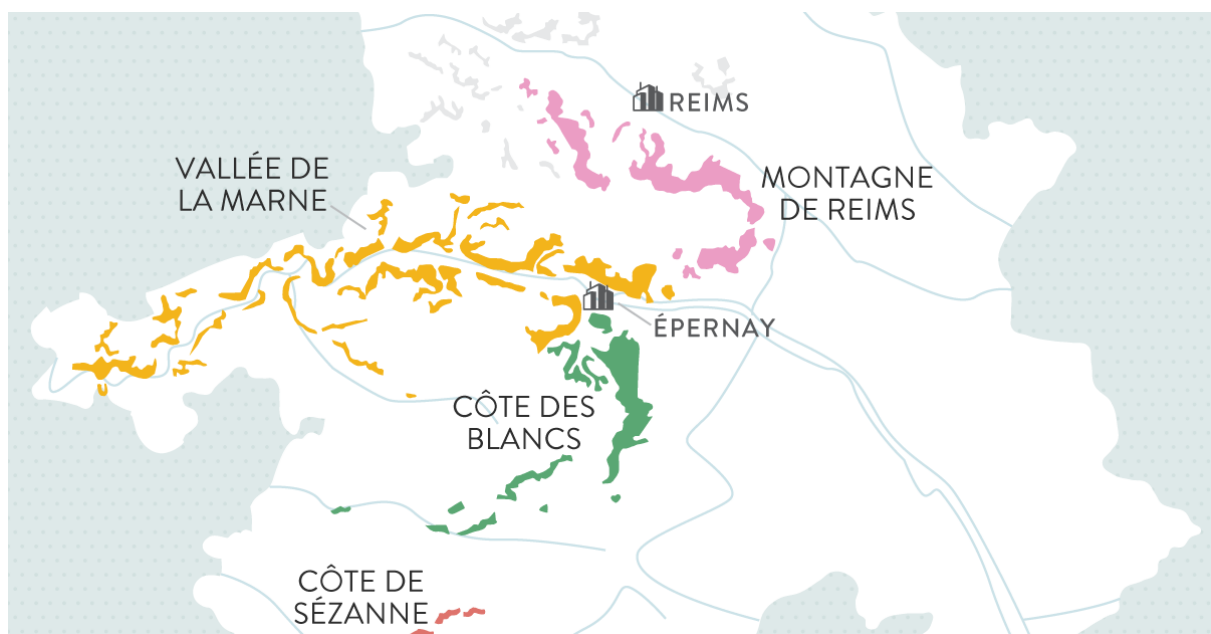
CHAMPAGNE - WINE PRODUCTION

The Champagne region, located about 150km east of Paris, is synonymous with sparkling wine – to the extent where other sparkling wines from around the world are often incorrectly referred to as Champagne. Such fame and reputation comes over time, with the oldest houses still in operation dating back to the late 1500s. Champagne, like most great discoveries, was first produced in a rather dramatic accident. Winemakers, who were attempting to make still wines like in Burgundy, found that their bottles would occasionally explode. The bravest (or drunkest!) of them decided to then drink the seemingly explosive wine and found that it was both delicious and fizzy. The rest, as they say, is history.

Chardonnay, Pinot Noir and Pinot Meunier make up the vast majority of grapes grown and Champagne is typically made using a blend of all three, with Pinot Meunier usually only making up a small percentage of the blend. There are however unblended Champagnes which are known as *Blanc de Blancs* and *Blanc de Noirs*.

Blanc de Blancs translates literally as ‘White of Whites’, and is the term used for Champagne (a white wine) only made using white grapes, referring to Chardonnay.

Blanc de Noirs, ‘White of Blacks’, refers to Champagne made using exclusively dark grapes, most commonly referring to Pinot Noir. Producing a clear wine using dark grapes may seem a little counter-intuitive but it is only the skin contact which gives a wine its colour. The juice from the grape itself is clear so a clear wine can be produced by simply not allowing any extended skin contact after pressing the grapes.

MARLBOROUGH AND NELSON - WINE PRODUCTION

Marlborough is New Zealand's most prominent wine making region and put New Zealand on the map in the 1980's, gaining international acclaim for its Sauvignon Blanc. In the late 2010s, Marlborough became the first region in New Zealand to introduce appellation laws, more commonly found in 'Old World' wine-producing countries such as France and Italy. These are known as Appellation Marlborough Wine and Methode Marlborough, which reassure consumers that the wine is produced using 100% Marlborough grapes and that the sparkling has been aged for at least 18 months on lees before release.

There are 3 main sub-regions in the area. Most of the high yield 'supermarket wine' is grown in the lower Southern Valleys, with higher quality wines coming from the Wairau Valley, and the most premium examples typically heralding from the Awatere Valley. This is due to the cooler drier and more mountainous sites which can be used to capture more sunlight.

Sauvignon Blanc from elsewhere in New Zealand is often described by using the Marlborough style as a comparative. So what is a Marlborough Sauvignon Blanc? The main characteristics are centred on vibrant stonefruit and passionfruit underpinned by a high acidity. Herbaceous, grassy notes are also common, but each vineyard will have its own unique terroir and so will have nuances around this base flavour profile. It is definitely not a homogenous style across all producers, but the consistent varietal bases provide consumers with a confidence in their selections.

Despite being far warmer than more southern regions of Central Otago and Canterbury, it is still too cool to fully ripen thicker-skinned red varieties such as Syrah or Cabernet, and so Pinot Noir still dominates red wine production. These do tend to be slightly heavier than their more southern counterparts due to the increased ripeness and more liberal oak use.

Nelson sees a significantly smaller number of plantings with a similar distribution of varieties to its neighbour. The Moutere Hills are home to the best examples, most notably, Neudorf.

HAWKE'S BAY AND GISBORNE - WINE PRODUCTION

Hawke's Bay is New Zealand's oldest (Mission Estate founded in 1851), and second largest wine region behind Marlborough. Overall, it is one of New Zealand's warmest wine regions, owing to its location on the calmer east coast of the North Island. The variety of geography and microclimates on display makes the region one of New Zealand's most diverse in terms of wine production. Huge names such as Esk Valley, Craggy Range, Paritua and Te Mata call Hawke's Bay home.

Coastal Areas in the Esk Valley and Te Awanga have a far cooler temperature, as does the higher altitudes of inland Central Hawke's Bay. This allows ripe and dark examples of Pinot Noir to flourish, along with excellent chardonnay.

A lot of the geography in the region is dictated by its four large rivers. Along the banks of these rivers are the sheltered alluvial plains that allow large scale production of Chardonnay and Merlot. Up on the higher elevation slopes of the river valleys, cooler temperatures produce some premium examples of cooler climate varieties such as Sauvignon Blanc, Chardonnay, Pinot Gris and Pinot Noir.

A far higher average temperature is found on the hillside sites in Havelock and the Esk Valley, and also in the Gimblett Gravels, perhaps the jewel in Hawke's Bay's crown. Large stones absorb heat from the sun during the day and then emit it throughout the cooler evenings. Acting almost like a blanket, this allows thick-skinned varieties such as Syrah, Cabernet Sauvignon and Merlot to thrive. As such, Gimblett Gravels produces some of New Zealand's most famous Syrah and Bordeaux blends, although not in huge quantity. It also produces some of the ripest examples of Chardonnay. These tend to undergo more significant winemaking and so the style is far bigger and bolder, with more oak influence, than Chardonnay from the South Island.

Gisborne has a smaller production which is more focussed on white wine. It is home to lesser seen varieties such as Chenin Blanc and Viognier, with Chardonnay and Pinot Gris providing the backbone to their industry. Millton Vineyards is our pick for the best that the region has to offer.

NORTH CANTERBURY - WINE PRODUCTION

Whilst there are a few vineyards south of Christchurch and on the Banks Peninsula, the heart of the Canterbury wine making industry is located to the north in the warmer sites of the Waipara Valley, home to Pegasus Bay and Black Estate, and just inland, in the adjoining Waikari Hills, where you will find the likes of Pyramid Valley and Bell Hill.

In the rain shadow of the Southern Alps to the west, the climate is dry and cool. Although warmer than Central Otago to the south, the climate is still well suited to the same varieties. Unlike Pinot Noir in Central Otago, there is not one particular varietal that has taken centre-stage, with a healthy distribution of several varieties across the region. These wines have slightly riper flavours than their southern counterparts, with more stonefruit entering the flavour profile. The riper flavours also allow slightly more oak influence. However, this tends to still be significantly less than you would find in the North Island, and so a healthy percentage of old oak is still used regularly. The varieties themselves lend themselves to less intrusive wine making techniques due to their delicate structure and desirable fruity freshness. However, there is a noticeable increase in this area when compared to Central Otago wines.

AUSTRALIA - WINE PRODUCTION

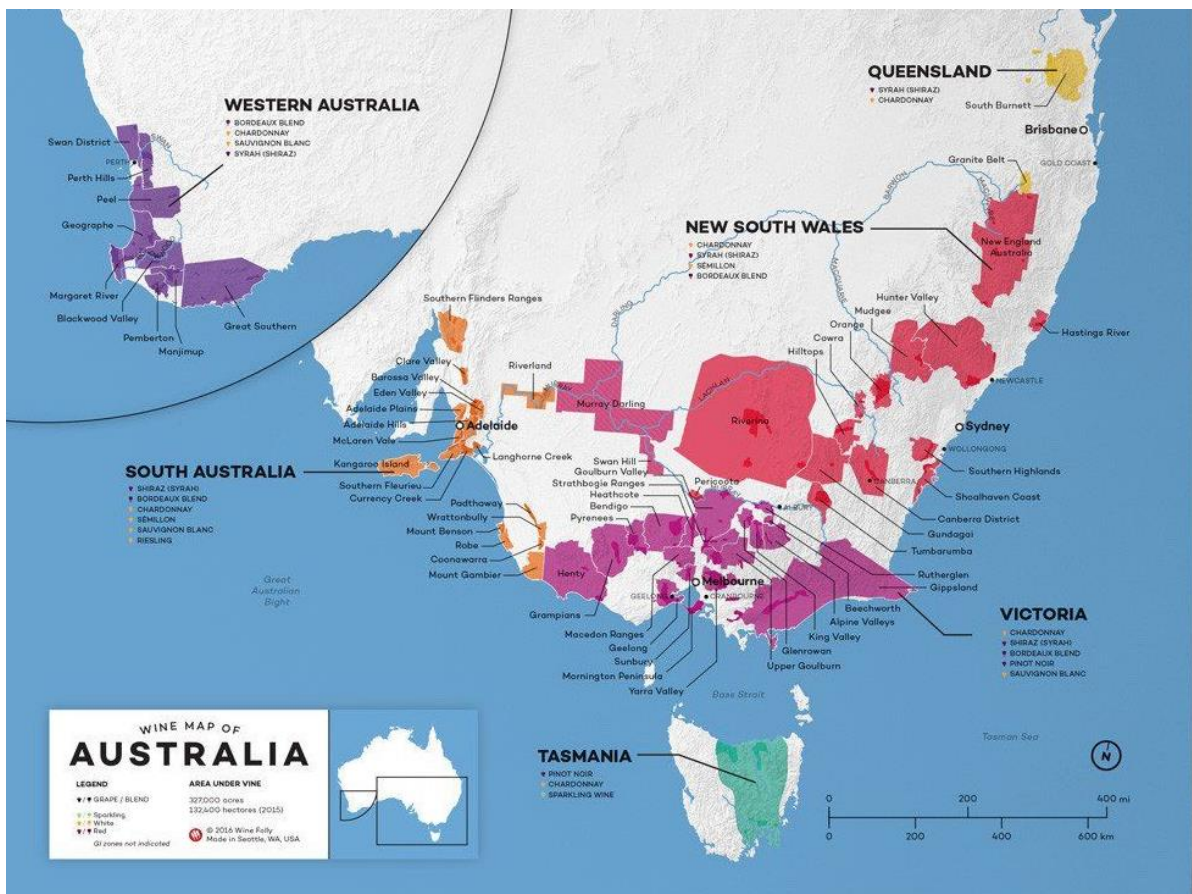
Australia is home to several different wine growing regions with quite a drastic range of climates. The majority of the regions are focussed around the southeast of the country, spread throughout South Australia, Victoria, and New South Wales. The southwest tip of Western Australia is the notable exception and must not be overlooked, home to some very prestigious regions such as Margaret River.

The wide range of conditions around the country results in a vast array of different styles of wine being produced. Chardonnay and Shiraz lead the way however in terms of production.

Cooler climates such as the Adelaide Hills and the Mornington Peninsula produce excellent lighter wines such as Sauvignon Blanc, delicate Chardonnay, and Pinot Noir.

Coastal areas such as Margaret River, despite having warm Mediterranean climates, make use of the cooling ocean breezes to bring Chardonnay and Sauvignon Semillon blends into play. These tend to be richer and more tropical than their counterparts grown in cooler climates. This leads to the Chardonnay in particular having more oak used in its production.

Warmer climates away from the coast such as Barossa Valley and Eden Valley are exceptionally dry and warm in Summer and produce big Shiraz and Cabernet Blends. Despite being very warm during the day, these areas can also get very cold at night. Clare Valley, for example, makes use of the cool nights and higher altitude sites to retain acidity and produce world class Riesling.

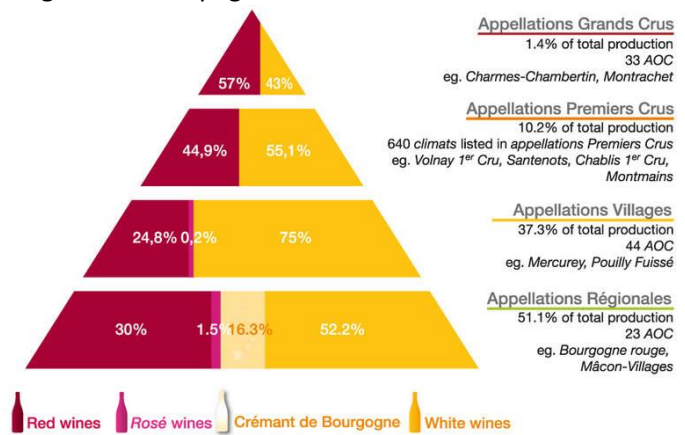
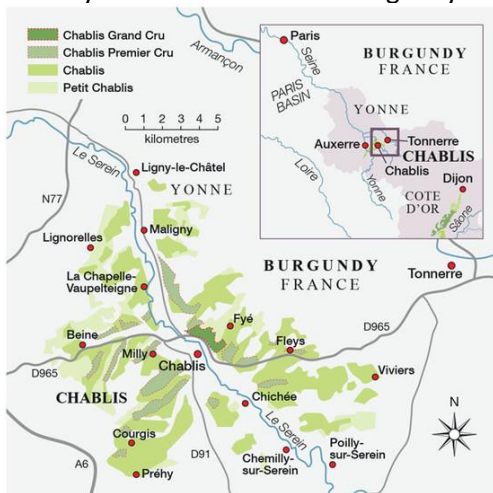

BURGUNDY - WINE PRODUCTION

Burgundy is the Old-World home of Chardonnay and Pinot Noir. Unlike in Bordeaux, whose wines are named after the Château producing them, Burgundy wines are named for their *terroir*, or the area of *cultivated land* they are produced from. There is a classification system which ranks the elite of Burgundy wines, known as *Grands Crus*, through to regional appellations. In Burgundy, *Premier Cru* sits below *Grand Cru*. This is a subtle, but important difference to Bordeaux classifications where *Premier Cru* denotes the best of the *Grand Cru* wines. The crown jewel of Burgundy is undoubtedly Romanée-Conti, which produces on average fewer than 6000 bottles per year, making it one of the hardest wines in the world to get your hands on. Chablis, although an appellation of Burgundy, geographically sits halfway between the rest of Burgundy and the region of Champagne to the north.

WAIRARAPA (MARTINBOROUGH) - WINE PRODUCTION

Just a short drive from Wellington, on the southern tip of the North Island lies the wine-making region of Wairarapa. It consists of three sub-regions: Masterton, Gladstone and Martinborough. The most highly regarded of these though is Martinborough, which is home to world-class producers such as Ata Rangi, Craggy Range, Dry River, Escarpment and Kusuda.

Pinot Noir is the region's flagship varietal. Despite Central Otago's recent fame and critical acclaim for their examples, Wairarapa is actually the home of Pinot Noir, with commercial plantings starting in the 1970's. However vines were first planted in the region almost 100 years prior.

Despite being on the climatically warmer North Island, the region is at a similar latitude to the northern reaches of Marlborough, and so is well-suited to growing similar varietals. It is therefore no surprise that Sauvignon Blanc also does very well in the region.

When compared to the other Pinot Noir powerhouse of Central Otago, Martinborough produces darker, riper fruit flavours underpinned by savoury notes unique to the terroir. The more powerful flavours lend themselves to slightly more oak compatibility, and therefore typically, these wines will show a bit more body in their structure.

Some producers are starting to move towards Syrah plantings and these show great promise, partly due to the very long growing season that the region enjoys. This also allows high quality production of dessert wine, mostly from Pinot Gris and aromatics such as Riesling and Gewürztraminer.

Varietal Production

Wairarapa produces just 3% of New Zealand's total plantings. Of this:

Pinot Noir – 48%

Sauvignon Blanc – 36%

Chardonnay – 6%

Pinot Gris – 4%

Other – 6%

AUCKLAND, WAIHEKE ISLAND AND NORTHLAND - WINE PRODUCTION

Auckland and Waiheke Island are connected by way of their volcanic soils and a warm maritime climate. Auckland consists of the sub-regions of Clevedon, Kumeu and Matakana, all of which produce top class wines. Some famous names from the region include Kumeu River, Puriri Hills and Nobilo.

Although not a large wine producing area in terms of plantings, quality Bordeaux blends and rich tropical Chardonnay dominate in the warm climate.

Waiheke Island sees more maritime influence, being an island, and so the Bordeaux blends and Chardonnay tend to be a touch lighter but more elegant than those from the mainland. Syrah from the island are unique in their slight herbaceous finish behind the crunchy dark fruit and spice. Fragrant, weighty Pinot Gris are also well produced. Some of the most prestigious names from New Zealand hail from Waiheke Island including Stonyridge, Man O War and Destiny Bay.

Northland is the most northerly wine producing region in New Zealand. Wine production is small, and is focussed on the flatter coastal areas of Whangarei and Kerikeri, where sea breezes can temper the high temperatures and help maintain acidity. The almost sub-tropical climate produces full bodied Chardonnay and Pinot Gris, with the flavour profile again leaning towards the tropical and stonefruit. Syrah and Merlot dominate producing spicy, ripe fruit forward wines.

SOUTH AFRICA - WINE PRODUCTION

South Africa is hot and dry, and if it wasn't for the cooling influence of the Benguela Ocean Current from the Antarctic, the 'Cape Doctor' – a cool southeasterly wind which flows up through Cape Town, and several mountainous regions, the country would be completely inhospitable to viticulture.

The country is most famous for its acidic Chenin Blanc which displays a full spectrum of fruit flavours from apple to apricot to pineapple and guava. However due to the variety of microclimates, other classical white varieties such as Semillon and Chardonnay do very well too. South Africa's flagship red variety is Pinotage, which originated from a cross between Pinot Noir and Cinsault. They display dark fruit, a full body and low acidity, making it very easy to drink. Cabernet Sauvignon is also produced in abundance due to the hot climate.

The most prestigious and well known region is Stellenbosch, which sits in a prime location on the coast, in the path of the Cape Doctor. It also has several mountainous sites which are ideal for premium viticulture.

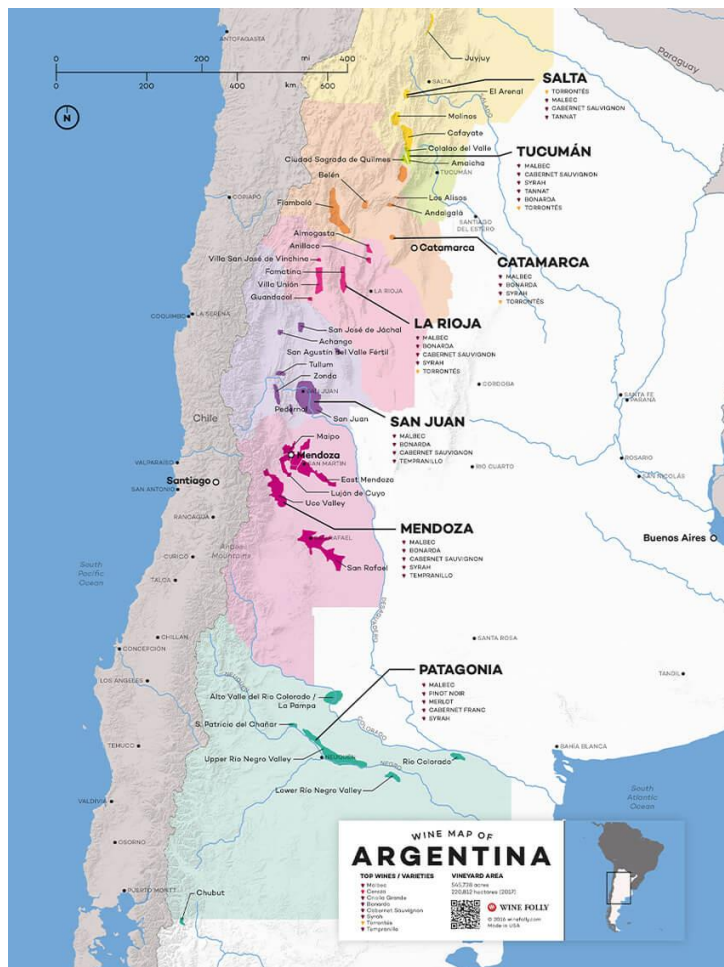
ARGENTINA - WINE PRODUCTION

Argentina's wine-growing regions can broadly be split into 3 areas.

El Norte, The North encompasses the regions of Salta, Tucumán and Catamarca. Salta contains the highest vineyards in the world at an altitude of around 3000m. This, in combination with a very dry climate provide exceptional conditions for viticulture. The native white grape, Torrontés, is the star here, although excellent Malbec and Cabernet Sauvignon is also produced.

Patagonia in the South, rivals New Zealand for the southernmost vineyards in the world. The cool, mountainous desert, much like in Central Otago, specialises in Pinot Noir, Chardonnay, Sauvignon Blanc, and Riesling. Of course, being Argentina, Malbec is also grown in abundance.

El Cuyo sits between these two areas and is home to La Rioja, San Juan and Mendoza. This is the heart of Argentinian wine production, with Mendoza and San Juan containing 95% of the country's vineyards. Malbec is the star here, with Mendoza being world famous for its best examples. Excellent full-bodied chardonnay is also produced.

ITALY - WINE PRODUCTION

Italy is the home of several world-renowned wines such as *Chianti*, *Barolo*, *Prosecco*, *Valpolicella*, *Soave* and *Orvieto*. It has a rich and diverse wine heritage dating back more than four thousand years. It is divided into 20 administrative wine regions. Due to their geographical locations they are clustered into three major domains; Northern, Central, and Southern Italy. The most significant wine regions when both quality and quantity are taken in consideration are *Tuscany*, *Piedmont* and *Veneto*.

NORTHERN ITALY

Northern Italy is composed of six growing regions: Piedmont, Valle D'Aosta, Lombardy, Trentino, Friuli and Veneto. Piedmont stands out as one of the two most sophisticated wine region in country, famous for its austere, tannic and floral red wines made from Nebbiolo. Sitting near northern border of the truly effective geographic wine-growing area with its continental climate, heavy fogs, and the rain-shadow effect from the neighbouring Alps. Northern Italian wines generally require a longer growing season to develop into some of the highest rated wines in the world.

CENTRAL ITALY

Central Italy is home to Tuscany, Umbria and Lazio facing the Tyrrhenian Sea while Romagna, Le Marche and Abruzzo on the east side of Apennine Mountains. The moderate, Mediterranean climate along with rolling hills, abundant sun, coastal winds from the Adriatic Sea and a mixture of limestone, sand, clay, and volcanic soils make this an environment conducive to vine growing and wine production. Sangiovese is widely produced in this region and prized for its acid structure, firm tannins, savoury characters and rich aromas of dark cherries.

SOUTHERN ITALY

Appellations like Molise, Puglia and Sicily, with miles of coastline with fertile and flat prairie lands, produce vast amounts of wines that range wildly in quality. Offering a warm Mediterranean climate due to its geographical location being closer to equator with abundance of coastal winds from the surrounding ocean and subtle mountain influences. Southern Italy is generally dry and sunny, producing sweeter and more full-bodied red and white wines that are increasingly available, inexpensive, and improving in quality over a period of time.

There are four wine classifications in Italy to distinguish the quality of the wine.

- **Vino da Tavola (VdT)** is the lowest classification and describes wines without a geographical indication - “table wine”.
- **Indicazione Geografica Tipica (IGT)** is next and is the broadest classification. These are often high quality and non-traditional wines.
- **Denominazione di Origine Controllata (DOC)** is the 2nd highest tier, which follows strict rules and produces high quality traditional wines. Each DOC has its own rules about permitted grape varieties, maximum harvest yields, and aging requirements.
- **Denominazione di Origine Controllata e Garantita (DOCG)** contains Italy’s finest wine and is the most exclusive of all the classifications, with 74 DOCG wines in circulation. DOCG wines have an additional “garantita,” or guarantee, by the Italian government to be wines of especially high quality. Each DOCG-labelled wine must pass a wine quality tasting panel, while DOC wines must merely be grown and made in accordance with the rules of the appellation.

SPAIN - WINE PRODUCTION

Wine regions are spread throughout Spain and are predominantly very warm and dry. The exception is *Galicia* to the Northwest, where the Atlantic Ocean provides a significant cooling effect. This allows the crisp, fruity native white grape, Albariño, to thrive.

Tempranillo, Garnacha (Grenache) and Airén (predominantly used in brandy production) dominate elsewhere in Spain with the best examples coming from *La Rioja* and *Castilla y León* which track the Ebro and Duero River respectively through the northern central highlands. Vega Sicilia, Spain’s most renowned producer is found in the latter, in a region known as the *Ribera del Duero*, close to the Portuguese border.

Andalucía is located on the south coast and has one of the hottest climates of any wine growing region in the world. Most famous for the region of *Jerez*, this is the heart of Spain’s sherry production.

There are several different quality classifications a wine can possess in Spain. Above the entry level table wines, these are broadly split into three levels. The IG (Identification Geográfica) speaks to the wines geographical characteristics but is quite relaxed in terms of viticulture and winemaking. The next level up is DO (Denominación de Origen). This has a more regimented set of rules in terms of quality, dictating production levels, permitted varietals, winemaking, and aging regulations. Only *Rioja* and *Prioret* occupy the highest classification of DOCa (Denominación de Origen Calificada). To qualify the wines must have been a DO for ten years and must be valued at double the cost of the average DO wine.

The age classifications vary when used in different regions, and when applied to a white varietal or a rose. For the more prestigious regions of Rioja and Ribera del Duero, the red wines have the following appellation rules: “**Crianza**” must be aged for a minimum of one year in oak barrel, then one year in bottle before release, “**Reserva**” must be aged for 3 years, with one year in barrel, and two in bottle, and “**Gran Reserva**”, aged for five years, two in barrel and three in bottle.

CÔTES DU RHÔNE - WINE PRODUCTION

The Côtes du Rhône, located in the South-East of France, tracks the Rhône Valley north from the Mediterranean Sea. In the Southern Rhône, the very warm climate produces spicy, rich red blends. 19 different varietals are permitted in the Southern Rhône but Grenache, Syrah, and Mourvèdre are produced in the greatest volume. The blends are typically named GSM blends after these three grapes.

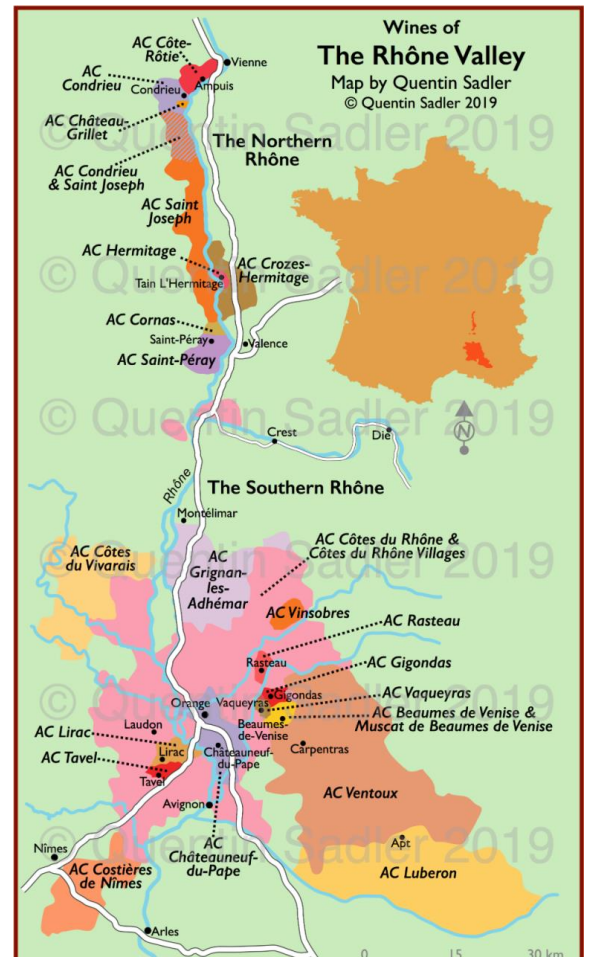
As we move into the Northern Rhône, the climate gets far cooler and harsher, and white wine production dominates. In the north the permitted white varietals are Viognier, Marsanne and Roussanne. The only red grape permitted is Syrah.

There are different classifications within the Côtes du Rhône which denotes the quality and prestige of the wine:

The entry level wines are known simply as *Côtes du Rhône* wines.

The next tier up is known as *Côtes du Rhône Villages*. Within this subset, the 21 highest quality villages have been permitted to include their name within the appellation as well.

Only 17 producers are a part of the highest class of Rhône wines, known as *Cru*. Of these, nine are in the South and eight are in the North.

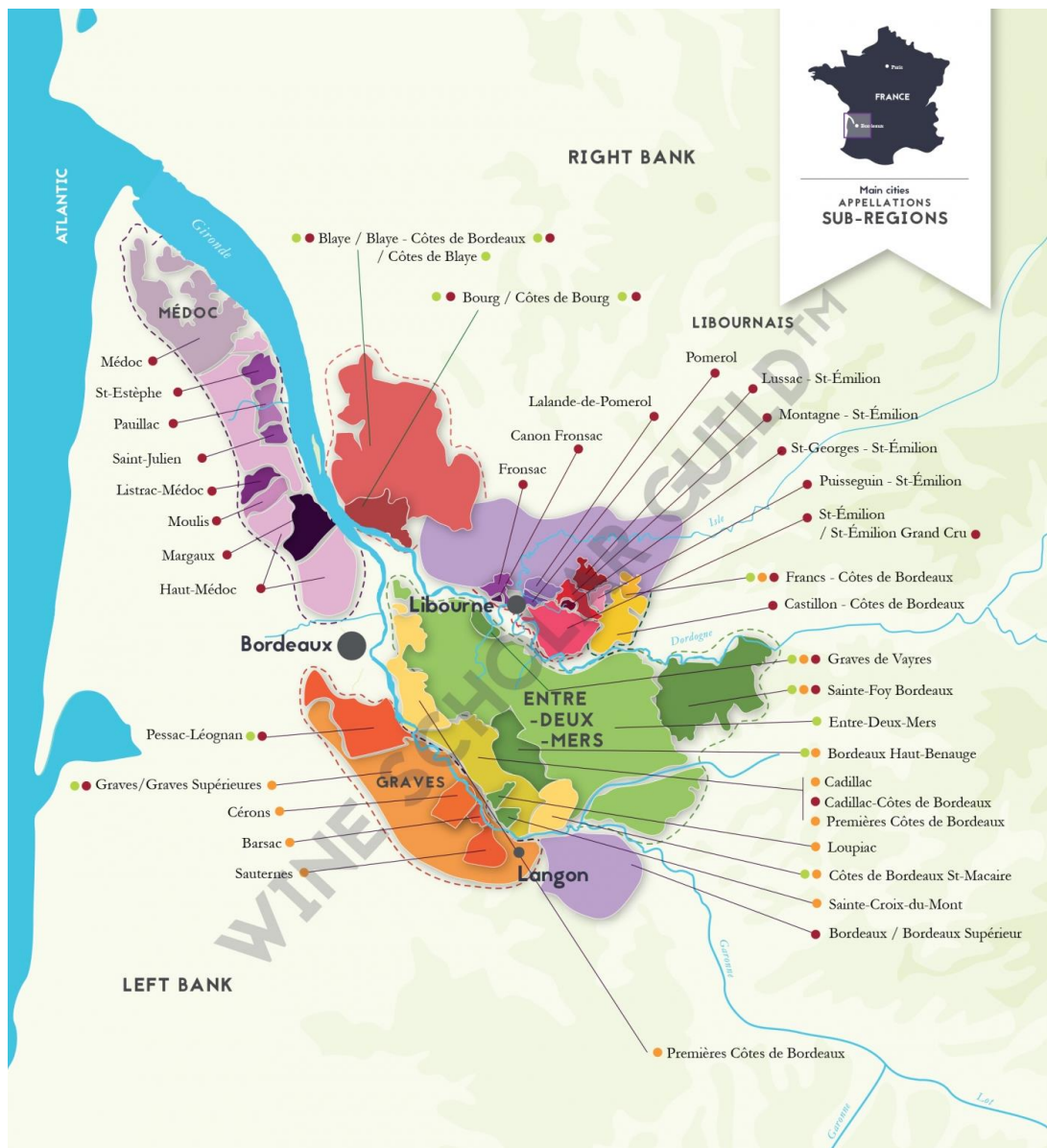

BORDEAUX - WINE PRODUCTION

There are several classifications of Bordeaux wine, depending on which side of the Gironde the wine originates from.

Left-Bank wines are Cabernet Sauvignon dominant and are subject to the *Bordeaux Wine Official Classification of 1855*. This recognises the highest quality châteaux as Grand Cru Classés, or Great Classified Growths. Within this, there are five further classes ranging from Premier Grand Cru, the best of the best, through to 5ème Grand Cru. There have been only five houses awarded Premier Grand Cru status. All of these feature on this list.

Right-Bank wines are Merlot dominant. Despite being home to several outstanding producers such as Petrus and Château L'Église Clinet in Pomerol, only the Saint-Émilion region has adopted a comparable classification system. This is known as *The Saint-Emilion Classification*. Within this classification there are two tiers of Premier Grand Cru, A and B. All other recognised châteaux are classified as Grand Cru.





FRANCE - BORDEAUX

Many of the wines featured below have achieved a rating by Mr. Robert Parker. Around the globe individuals and wine critics alike have come to trust the palate of this world famous wine professional. His score (which is out of 100) has, over the past 25 years, become a guide to the quality and expense of wines from Bordeaux. Here at the Rees, we stock a selection of wines from the different regions of Bordeaux.
